irections for Construction:

- 1 Answer each question in rough draft first, to save circles.
- 2. Use one circle per instruction. Stay inside the pentagon. Put your name on the circle somewhere, and number each circle relative to its instruction.
- 3. You will hand in each circle after it is completed. Do not cut out circles until all 12 are completed and you are ready to create your sphere.
- 4. Cut out each circle. Fold on the lines and attach the arcs to each other securely using glue.
- 5. Get creative! Remember, you are being graded for creativity and content. We are also using these to decorate the classroom!
- 6. The book must be completely read by circle #5!

Circle Instructions:

- Circle #1 Write the title and the author in the circle. Use the entire space. Decorate.
- · Circle #2 Write four facts about the author.
- Circle #3 Draw a picture of the main character. Lots of detail and complete use of space, please!
- Circle #4 Describe the main character in the story. Include physical and personality traits in your description.
- Circle #5 Draw a picture or map of the setting of the story.
- Circle #6 Must have the entire novel read by this point! Draw or otherwise artistically portray, the most exciting, funniest, or saddest part of the book.
- Circle #7 In a paragraph, tell about the most exciting, funniest, or saddest part of the book. Remember to tell why you think it is so.
- Circle #8, #9, #10 On these three circles, write a summary of the book. Include all important events and themes. Use all of the space. (That doesn't mean that you just write big!) Use detail and be specific!
- Circle #11 In a paragraph, tell what your opinion of the book is.
 Be specific, and give reasons for your thoughts.
 Circle #12 Write a poem based on the novel or the main character.
